YA (Young adult) summer reading recommended by FMG Book Club members
















The novels Looking for Alaska (John Green), If I Stay (Gayle Forman), Every Day (David Levithan), The Giver (Lois Lowry), The Maze Runner (James Dashner), We All Fall Down (Eric Walters), and Room, (Emma Donoghue) are, for the most part, expected teenage choices, considering the protagonists are adolescents on surreal or challenging journeys: existing between life and death, waking up each day in the body of a new teenage identity, experiencing unrequited love, rebelling against the forces of a totalitarian society, surviving in a post-apocalyptic world, and trying to escape a building on fire set ablaze by a commercial airplane. Room is the exception. Narrated by a 5-year-old boy this novel is exempt from teenage romance and angst, is not set in a futuristic society, and there are no teenagers on the run. Rather, it takes place in ordinary society - albeit under horrifying circumstances - realistically portraying the powerful and unbreakable bond between a mother and son held hostage, the sacrifices a mother makes and the risks she takes for the safety and well-being of her child. Definitely mature subject matter for the young reader, Room is, above all else, about the love between a parent and child and the resilience of the human spirit – themes with which any of us, at any age, can identify.
